4:05	Guest Speaker: Chris Palmer, The Bridge Youth and Family Resource Center Manager	(Chris) The Bridge is a free resource available in Ada County. We are a diversion program. We are trying to distant ourselves from juvenile justice even though we are associated with Ada County Juvenile Justice. We are all about families and kids that need help. We have been blown away from the support and feedback we receive regarding the program. We offer tours of our location if anyone is interested and on base, we offer a case management system that tracks case loads and available resources throughout the Treasure Valley. We usually get a kid as the referral but we want the family. We focus on whole family wellness. We ask the parents – what are you doing for yourself throughout this process? We won't turn any case away, want to give them services and can help with legal aid, paying bills, food needs, etc. We will give them resources and follow-up. For example, of we had a Mom calling about her 34-year-old daughter who is an alcoholic and gave her resources. We typically like to see referrals before kids are in high school. A lot of times, high school is too late, we want to work with these kids when they are younger. The Bridge has been open for 2 years. We have seen a decline in police reports and petitions. We receive 80+ referrals a month. Please visit our 'About' page to look at the Bridge Bulletins to see specific stats. The Bridge 2024 Annual Report also shows a lot of information. We want to push out services in the community. Once again, the Bridge is FREE. (Danielle) What are the biggest gaps with needs in the community? (Chris) Spectrum kids and parents needing help managing them once they get older. Parenting resources and assessments are another gap. For example, where can we send those kids to get a diagnosis if needed? We also would like more engagement from the SROs. (Danielle) How



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		often do you get referrals from schools? (Chris) All the time. Meridian School
		Resource Officers are great at calling and referring families to the Bridge.
		(Yoonwa) Build a Bridge in Meridian. (Chris) We are getting there. (Susie) Do you
		have success getting parents and family members involved? (Chris) We have about
		70% of parents that complete the program. (Susie) How are you funded? (Chris)
		We were originally grant funded, but Ada County has re-allocated funds and re-
		classified positions, all our employees are Ada County employees. And are funded
		currently under the Ada County budget. (Susie) I may have a grant that could help
		buy some hygiene products. (Chris) Perfect, Amy Herrick runs that side of it. <u>Email</u>
		or call us (208-577-4820) with that information. (Yoonwa) So just to clarify,
		Elementary School referrals are good? (Chris) Yes, send them our way. The focus is
		really on the parents. (Hailey) Thank you for being here and thank you to the

	Presenting at Idaho Conference on Alcohol and Drug Dependency on tobacco and
	tobacco cessation. The stats surrounding tobacco cessation and policy in
	behavioral health/SUD treatment services: we know that tobacco use is 2-3x more
	prevalent among people with mental illness when compared to general
	population. According to SAMHSA, 89% of treatment facilities in the U.S. screen
	for tobacco use, 70% offer counseling, 42% offer NRT, and 35% offer non-nicotine
	prescription medication. For policy: 59% have policy permitting smoking/vaping in
	designated outdoor areas, 35% have it not permitted anywhere on campus (inside
	or outside) and 6% permit it anywhere outside. CDH is launching <u>Summer</u>
	Cessational Challenge that is 8 weeks long starts on June 9 th . Participants can send
